This version started as a tortuous "mistake" while transposing from A to D.

This fine balance is, I believe, the essence of any community music project. I can't even imagine our Community Music Project without Paul and Cynthia, whose musical and spiritual guidance has so often saved me from myself. There is only one way to repay such a debt - hold the torch as high as I am able. As always, my deep gratitude to these singer-songwriters - who despite suffering through my learning to record, mix and engineer, still delivered transcendent music to the microphone. This applies especially to Cynthia and Jesse, who have also suffered through my learning to be a better human being.
